

Nomination for the 2021-2022 Board of Governors Award

This award reaches beyond those usually awarded for television news and production. The Board of Governors Award recognizes achievements by individuals, organizations, or companies in community service or other worthwhile endeavors within the National Capital Chesapeake Bay's region. Historically, the Board of Governors Award is given for truly outstanding achievement and unique accomplishment of some duration and durability.

Nominating person/organization will be responsible for producing a short video piece on the honoree, if selected, to play at the Emmy® Awards Gala on June 25, 2022.

AWARDS: An Emmy® statuette is given for this award with the possibility of more than one award, or no award recipient. This award can be given to an individual, a company, or an organization for outstanding achievement in the arts, sciences or management of television which is either of a cumulative nature or so extraordinary and universal in nature as to be beyond the realm of the awards presented in the categories of achievement.

NOMINATIONS: Members of the Board of Governors of the National Capital Chesapeake Bay Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences nominate for consideration by the Board, the individuals, companies, and/or organizations which they consider merit this highest in time to be considered at a Governors meeting at least one month prior to the presentation of the awards.

Nominations can only be made by a current Board of Governor, Executive Committee Member or Ex-Officio Presidents. Written submissions are mandatory and should be sent to adixon@capitalemmys.org.

The Board of Governors will vote on the candidates at the April 12th Board meeting.

PRELIMINARY VOTE: The Board of Governors discusses the nominations at this meeting and then votes, in secret, a preliminary ballot to determine by majority vote which of the nominations will be considered for the award.

SECONDARY VOTE: The Board of Governors then votes a second ballot, in secret, to select the recipient(s) of the Governors' Award, if any. A five-sixth (5/6th) favorable vote of the members of the Board of Governors present at the meeting is required for an award to be given.
